



## FAQ's

### Dr. Ed Davis Scholarship

**Question 1: Can my video be shorter than two minutes?**

Your video has to be a maximum of two minutes, but preferably longer than one minute.

**Question 2: Do I have to select a teacher from my current school?**

You can select any teacher that was once or is a current UCPS employee. The teacher can be current, retired, or a former UCPS teacher from any grade level.

**Question 3: Can other people be in my video?**

Yes, as long as they have a secondary role in the video.

**Question 4: What do I put for the "Accepted for Admission" section if I haven't received any of my college acceptance letters?**

Simply type "I haven't received my admission decision yet and the decision is expected by...(date of decision)" in the text box.

**Question 5: Can I apply for both the Janet Tyson Scholarship and the Dr. Ed Davis Scholarship?**

Yes!

**Question 6: Who is Dr. Ed Davis?**

Dr. Ed Davis is the founder of the Union County Education Foundation, and a long-time volunteer Board member, and we use this scholarship to honor him and his legacy as an educator. He was Superintendent of UCPS for seven years and it was his vision to provide college scholarships to UCPS students.

**Question 7: Does my scholarship have to be used for a 4-year university?**

No, it does not. The scholarship may be used at a community college as well as long as your long-term plan is to receive a Bachelor's degree.

**Question 8: Is the Letter of Recommendation required?**

Yes, it may be either uploaded as a PDF or submitted through a confidential link that will be given to your contact person at your school (Make sure to give the person that is writing the recommendation a one week notice). You may also need to alert them that the link will come from reviewr.com and to check their spam folder if they don't receive the link.

**Question 9: Does the teacher have to be a traditional classroom teacher? Our definition of a teacher is someone who works with children the majority of the day. This includes coaches, CDC coordinators, school counselors, speech therapists, teachers, and assistant teachers.**
